- Schorpioenen gif
- China, Turkije, India en Perzie; menselijke pokken (variolatie) vanaf 1600
- Amerika (1720) en Engeland (1730) vanuit Turkije
- 20 % van de mensen stierf aan pokken en 40% kindersterfte kwam door pokken, effect op legers.
- Jenner (1743-1823), plattelandsarts
- -1800 ontdekking van vaccinatie
- (vacca; koe/ vaccina; koepokstof)
- Pasteur (rabies), Koch (cholera, difterie)
- 1850 Engeland verplicht vaccinatie pokken
- 1980 WHO; koepokken de wereld uit

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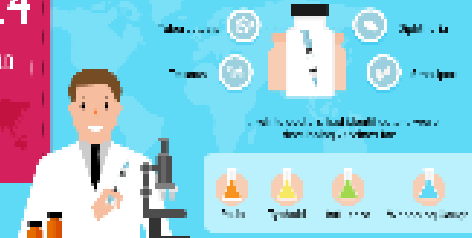

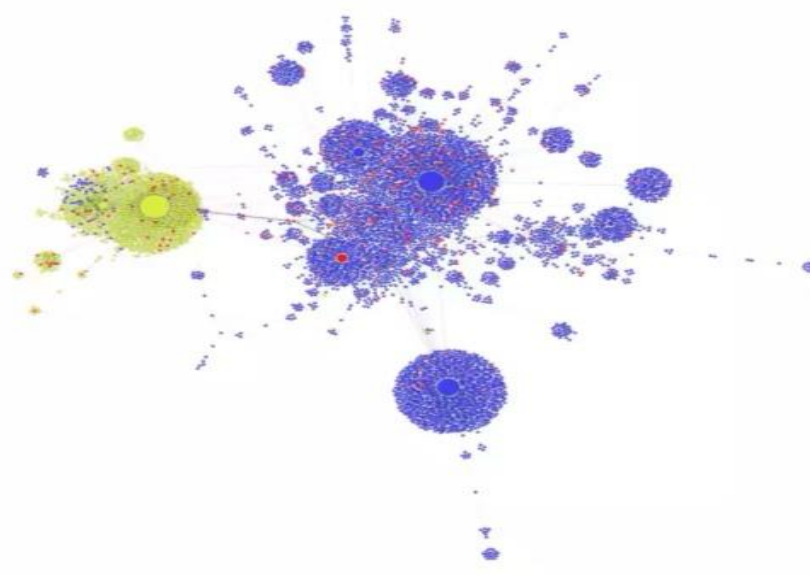
